

NEW INCURABLES' HOME URGED BY WEINSTEIN

To the Editor of The Standard Union:

The Daughters of Israel Home for Incurables was recently reorganized. It opened its executive offices at 1320 St. John's place. The society has a membership of about 1,000. It was organized several years ago.

The activities of this organization, up to the present time, were confined to visiting and aiding the Jewish incurables now housed in the Kings County Hospital.

The number of Jewish incurables, however, has increased to such an extent, not only in Kings County Hospital, but also in the private homes, that it has been deemed advisable to build a home for incurables.

A membership drive is now on to increase the membership of the organization as the growing demand for a home we are planning is imperative in Brooklyn, which has no institution where these patients could be housed among the surroundings and in keeping with their traditions.

It is hoped that very shortly plans will be on foot to begin the construction of a home and the organization is now contemplating buying a suitable location for the construction of such a building.

The membership of this organization, up to recently was confined solely to women. However, it was found advisable to admit men as well as women. Men and women are therefore urgently requested to join as members.
