

Rosh ha-Shanah Rites Mark Jews' 5706th Yr.

With the traditional sounding of the shofar, or ram's horn, Jewish congregations throughout Brooklyn ushered in their 5706th New Year at sunset services last night. The services, held again this morning in all synagogues and to be conducted tomorrow morning, opened

a ten-day period of penitence and prayer which will end on Yom Kippur, Day of Atonement, on Monday, Sept. 17.

Every congregation in Brooklyn held New Year's services with special prayers arranged for men and women at military and naval installations and in hospitals. Prayers were read at the bedside of wounded veterans.

The Rev. Solomon Shapiro, rabbi of the Jewish Sanitarium and Hospital for Chronic Diseases, Rutland Road and E. 49th St., read special prayers for the 525 patients of the hospital. Ambulatory patients were wheeled to the synagogue while bedridden ones heard the hymns and prayers over the amplifying system.
